New World Order Through Yarmouk Symposium

Subsequent to an invitation by Yarmouk University Symposiums and Lectures Committee, a symposium was held under the title

The New World Order" Participants included Mr. Taher al-Masri, ex-prime minister and Dr. Mamdouh Abbadi, former minister of health. The symposium was run by Dr. Abdul-Razzaq Bani Hani, Yarmouk University.

Mr. Masri spoke about the aspects and major components of the new world order. Led by U.S.A. which aims to control the world. Mr. Masri said: "For any great power to control the world or a part thereof, it must possess certain instruments which it will use via three pivots: economic, military and political".

Mr. Masn emphasized the importance of the economic pivot where competition therein became a characteristic of our time through the largest three economic blocs in the world: U.S.A., Western Europe and Japan. The military pivot receives special atten-



tion of U.S.A. to make up for the gaps in the economic and political pivots and tries to develop it continuously as exemplified in the star warfare program. The political pivot is demonstrated through U.S. intervention in the affairs of a large number of countries and peoples as in the Gulf War and the last developments in the Soviet Union, which shows that U.S.A. is in a hurry to create a new world order before it loses the advantages

which help it do that.

Mr. Masri alluded to the absence of an Arab role vis a vis that is going on despite the world wide economic significance of the Arab World. He urged for a life in more democratic societies and for the creation of an Arab order to face present and future challenges.

Dr. Abbadi, in turn, spoke about this world order which was presented following all the recent changes which have taken place in the world like the collapse of the USSR-led socialist bloc, the Gulf War and the Arab-Israeli talks. He added that this order is still in the process of formation and is essentially based on the relation between the wealthy lord of the North and the needy vassal of the south. Although there is a conflict of interests and ideas between the two sides, mutual interaction between them is an inevitable reality, Dr. Abbadi said.

He also referred to the greater tendency towards democracy, the
